Low Deck Heights

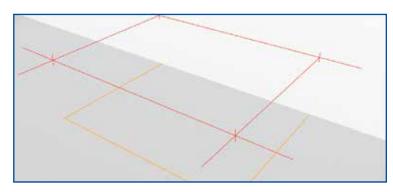
Preparation & Pre-Start Checks

- · Ensure the site is clean, level, and free from debris
- Confirm the subfloor or ground is structurally sound and suitable for the framing system.
- Read all installation information
- Review structure design layout

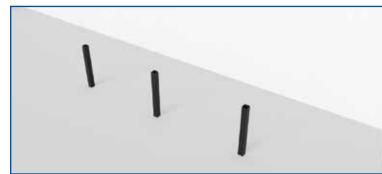

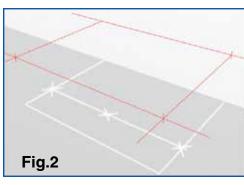
STEP 1 - SET OUT



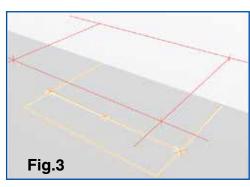




1. Use a chalk/string line or laser line to mark the outer edges of the structure on the ground or subfloor. Ensure all corners are set as 90 degree angles.



2. Mark according to the provided deck plan, the centre of the desired footing locations.



3. Double check all measurements to ensure accuracy.

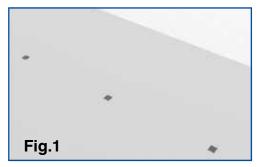

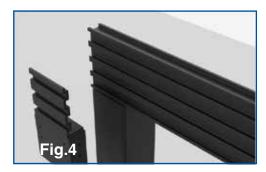
1. Prepare ground ready to insert posts to be concreted in making sure they are level/plumb.



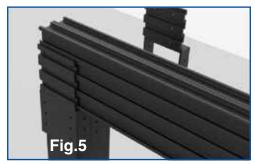
2. Concrete posts in place and once secure, mark your finished deck level, minus the joist, beam, and surface height. Make sure they are level for your deck height by refering to the height of the ledger plate.



3. Cut posts using a cutting saw to the desired height marked above, ensuring that all posts are level.



4. Install A210 bracket on top of the post in preparation for the beams.



5. Once beam has been installed, secure A211 bracket to the other side of the post, so the beam has been scured from either side.

Repeat this process for all posts.

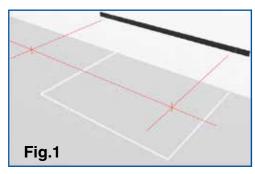
Please note:

We recommend drilling a 5mm hole at the bottom of each post to allow any excess water to drain through.

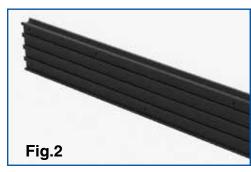
STEP 3 - LEDGER







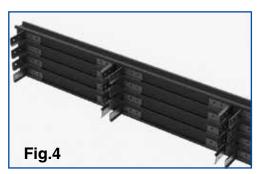
1. Cut the ribbon/ledger plate to the desired measurement. Refer to the deck plans or shop drawings provided.



2. Pre-drill at alternating heights the cut profile to suit your connection fittings.



3. Connect the ribbon/ledger plate to the building structure at the desired height, using fixings approved by your local engineer.

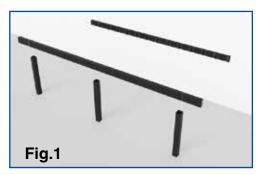


4. Joists to ledger connection detail will look similar to this detail depending on what joist will be used.

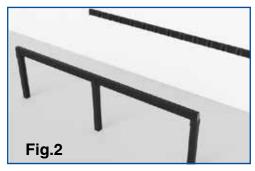
STEP 4 - BEAM



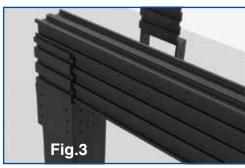




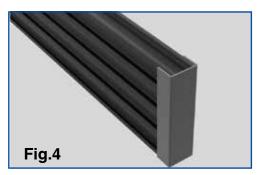
1. Mark and cut beams to the desired length using a cutting saw.



2. Place beams onto 'beam to post' bracket ensuring position of beams is in the correct location.



3. Use A210 and A211 brackets to secure beam to post and repeat for all post to beam connections.



4. Attach A220 end cap on all open ended beams if applicable.

Double Beam

A double beam is 2 beams secured together for extra strength



Flush Beam

A flush beam is a beam level with the joists on a deck



Drop Beam

A drop beam is a beam installed below the deck joists for added support



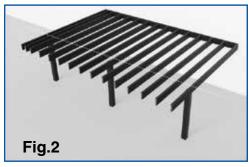
STEP 5A - JOISTS FOR DROP BEAM



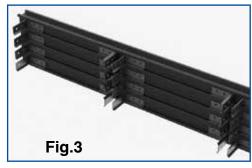




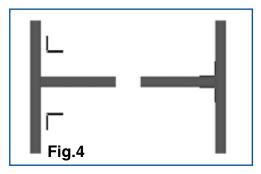
1. Use a tape measure and silver pen to mark along flush beam and ledger plate joist positions. Be sure to follow the correct joist centres for your selected surface.



2. Follow the DeckPlanner 'Cut Joists' file to the correct length, using an aluminium cutting saw. Repeat this for all joists required, making sure to confirm that all on site measurements and surface manufacture specs are the same as the deck plans.



3. Place joists in between beams using A201 brackets to connect to joists with ribbon/ledger plate using the supplied fixings. Refer to frame components and common connections for specific details.



4. Lift joists into location sliding A201 brackets into joists for temporary hold while you screw all brackets.



5. Finally ensure all components are fully secure as per connection requirements.

Drop Beam

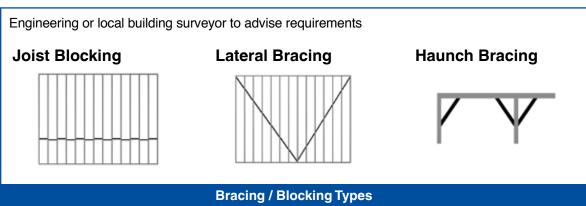
A drop beam is a beam installed below the deck joists for added support

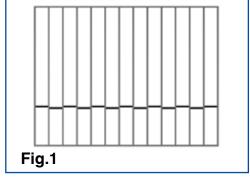


STEP 6 - BRACING (joist blocking)





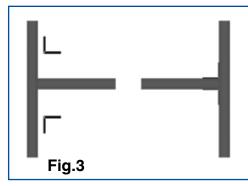




1. Mark out position / location according to requirements set by local building surveyor or licensed engineer. Typically this is over the beam alternating either side of centre.



2. Cut the blocking to fit between the joists.

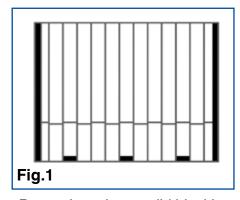


3. Preload A201 brackets into the cut profiles and install into deck structure.

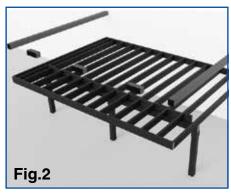
STEP 7 - HANDRAIL/RAILING BLOCKING



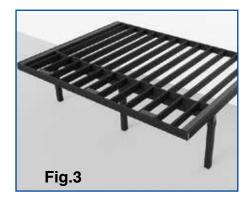




1. Determine where solid blocking will be required. Refer to SD850 for engineered detailed QwickBuild® solid blocking options.



2. Cut solid blocking using a circular saw to required length, repeating the process for all required blocking.



3. Pre-drill frame using a 6mm drill bit according to corresponding standard detail. Use the provided A404 screws to fix the solid blocking to the joists ensuring the blocking is flush with the top of the joists.
